Annotations on Map 10 Landscape Context

There are three text boxes on this map, each with an arrow pointing to a specific area on the map. To make this information accessible to people using screen reading technology, the exact content of each of text box is given here - in no particular order of significance. A preliminary sentence has been added at the beginning of each text box description to describe where the text box arrow points on the map.

1. Arrow points to Moyle forest - the most southerly afforested area of the Moyle/Ratagan/Leachachan forest block. The text label states: To the south of the NSA catchment, the forest is less visible. It forms the backdrop to the Glen More area.
2. Arrow points to the afforested slopes above Ratagan, Leachachan and Loch Duich. The text label states: Highly visible afforested slopes above the shore of Loch Duich. Planting design needs to complement landscape setting to help integrate forest with its surroundings.
3. Arrow points to coastal slopes above Loch Alsh in the Bernera/Ardintoul forest block. The text label states: Visible slopes above Loch Alsh/Kylerhea Narrows. Felling coupe shapes must respond to landform shape and scale in order to complement setting.
