



Glen Prosen Fencing Proposals Map Accessible Text

FLS Glen Draft Prosen Fencing Proposals - indicative fence lines overlaid on the concept plan for woodland creation and habitat restoration.

Phase 1

Cormuir compartment – deer fence with rabbit netting along march, coming down to tie onto NRF riparian fencing below Hill of Strone. Self-closing gates to allow for pedestrian and vehicle access.

Tied onto Cormuir compartment, extend deer fence along western march towards the NRF project compartment at Craigie Thieves.

NRF project riparian enclosures along Prosen Water.

Implement mitigations to prevent bird strikes on deer fences along the bottom of the glen - minimise extent of fencing in this area where possible.

NRF project riparian enclosures along Burn of Kilbo and Burn of Louie.

Repair weak points in plantation fence.

NRF project - 155ha deer fenced for natural regeneration at Craigie Thieves - to be completed by Apr 26.

Phase 2

Deer fence below Driesh and down to King's Seat, tying onto internal deer fence in bottom of the glen. Include self-closing pedestrian gates for access on Kilbo Path.

Deer fence along march with Clova Estate to protect against ingress following completion of neighbouring woodland scheme. Tie onto internal existing plantation deer fence.

Phase 3

Deflection fence on western march up to the Mayar Burn - must be high spec with robust annual maintenance to ensure effectiveness. Maintain strong ranger presence and deer culling in the open area across the north of the glen in order to protect establishment of montane scrub and peatland restoration -progress will be reviewed and if restoration objectives are not being met more fencing may still be required in this area.
