

Battle of Killiecrankie 1689

- Pass of Killiecrankie to West
- Main battlefield to North West
- Little relevance to LMP

SPA Cairngorms massif

- Habitat for Golden Eagle
- Spread of FLS conifer regeneration onto SPA

SSSI Pass of Killiecrankie

- For upland oak woodland and invertebrates
- Contains Sessile oak, Wych elm, Hazel, Alder, Birch
- Beech and Rhododendron being removed
- Traditionally some Oak and Hazel coppicing

SSSI Ben Vrackie

- For upland vegetation and associated birds
- Arctophilic site on calcareous soils
- Cabinnick outcrops, exposed, difficult to graze
- Birds: Hen harrier, Merlin, Peregrine, Shorteared Owl

NSA at Killiecrankie

- Killiecrankie: The Aspen Wood
- Rich and varied woodland in origin and type
- Native and exotic trees change with seasons
- Dramatic steep sided gorge, pinch point
- Water: reflective pools and rapids
- Panoramic view from Craigower Hill.
- A9 views through Gateway to the Highlands
- Good access and recreation
- Pass of Killiecrankie and historical associations

SLA Ben Vrackie The speckled mountain

- Panoramic views from Ben Vrackie
- Part of backdrop to Pitlochry
- Link to wider hills of Cairngorms
- Upland archaeology

SAC River Tay

- Key species is Atlantic Salmon
- Other species: Sea, Brook and River lamprey, Otter.
- Risk of sediment run off from FLS land during works

Potentially Vulnerable Area River Tay catchment

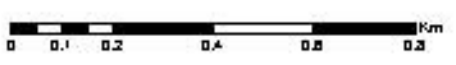
- Faskally is about 2% of catchment
